#### Immunizations

**Are your scholar's immunizations up to date?  
Did you get a letter from the school office staff requesting  
updated immunization documentation?**

**Scholars whose vaccinations are not in compliance will be subject to the  
mandatory Milwaukee school's exclusion period:**

**Monday, October 15th thru Thursday, October 18th.**

Please send documentation of your scholar's updated immunization information into the office.

**Note:** Wisconsin State Immunization law requires that all students entering the 6th grade receive dose of Tdap vaccine. To be compliant with the school law parents must provide their child's school with proof of immunization or claim a waiver.

**Below are a list of resources to have your child immunizations updated.**

Looking for quality health care services for you and your family? Progressive Community Health Centers has four clinics located nearby: **Lisbon Avenue Health Center** (3522 W. Lisbon Avenue), **Hillside Family Health Center** (1452 N. 7th Street), **Kilbourn Avenue Health Center** (1218 W. Kilbourn Avenue-inside Aurora Sinai physician office tower) and **12th Street Urgent Care** (945 N. 12th Street-next Aurora Sinai emergency room). Progressive offers medical, dental and behavioral health services for all ages and incomes. They accept most forms of insurance, including Medicaid (BadgerCare, Forward card) and have a sliding fee scale for the uninsured. Progressive also hosts immunization clinics and manages our school's Seal-A-Smile oral health program. 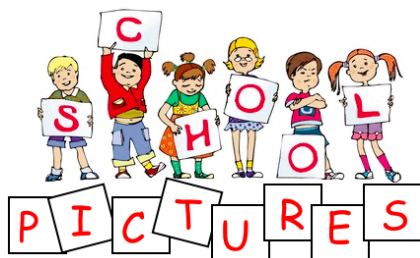

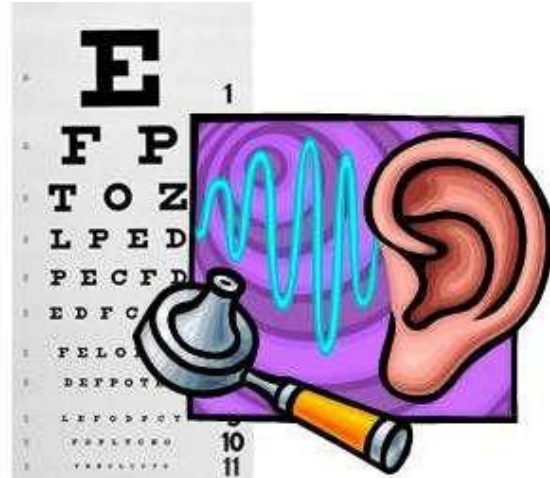
